Pioneers Grant Program Sparks Change in 2011

To commemorate the Pioneers 100th Anniversary, there have been 21 community grants awarded for the Pioneers Volunteer Community Grant Program. The grants range in size from \$10,000-\$50,000 and span across communities in North America including Arkansas, Florida, New Jersey, Kansas, Wisconsin, Texas, Georgia, New Mexico, Colorado, Arizona, Utah, Washington, Minnesota, Iowa, Connecticut, Alabama, Utah, Washington DC, Rhode Island, Prince Edward Island and Saskatchewan.

New Outlook Pioneers Southwest Chapter #136 will help address literacy needs in a grants project providing tools and resources for a cutting edge reading program in Nevada elementary schools while Southern States Chapter #134 will join AT&T Pioneers in refurbishing an after-school recreational center in Atlanta, GA providing kids with a safe environment to meet and socialize. Southwest Chapter #136 Arkansas Council members will volunteer to help restore the L.C. & Daisy Bates House Museum in Little Rock, Arkansas, a National Historic Landmark based on its role in the Central High School desegregation crisis in 1957. New Outlook Pioneers Penn-Jersey Chapter #132 members will be volunteering alongside AT&T and Verizon Pioneers in a community grants project to beautify Liberty State Park in New Jersey, aiding in the conservation of native bird species as well as providing opportunities to view and study wildlife.
