Buckle Bears Saving Lives

The Tennessee Highway Patrol (THP) contacted the President of the Nashville Life Member Club with a dire request: Save Our Children.

After THP explained the need to eliminate instances of children riding unbuckled or unrestrained in vehicles, Pioneers responded with a resounding “Yes!”

The club set out to make enough “Buckle Bears” for each officer to have five bears to carry in their vehicles. The project goal was to create 1,000 bears complete with a hand-made seat belt and backpack containing a safety coloring book and crayons.

The goal was met when 1,000 “Buckle Bears” were presented to the THP in time for the kick-off of THP’s program, “Save the Children -Buckle Up!”

Troopers present the bears to children who are found to be improperly restrained or not buckled up at all – in hopes of encouraging child safety restraint usage.

The Nashville Life Member Club created this project, investing over 4,000 hours. The project also engaged others by sponsoring a “Stuff a Bear Day” in the lobby of the Nashville headquarters building, inviting AT&T employees and even tourists in Nashville to come by and stuff a bear.

Verizon West Aids Montecito Fire Victims

During the recent Southern California brush fires, Verizon Pioneers assisted the evacuees with over 100 gift bags containing many of the daily care needs that were left behind in the rush for safety.

Over 1,940 acres and 230 homes were destroyed, changing what was a beautiful area into a pile of ash.

The victim’s feelings were expressed poignantly when one of them offered to help us carry the bags we had prepared for them.

When we told her what we had put together she was amazed that we were thoughtful enough to consider their immediate needs. She explained that it had been 3 days

since she had really been able to enjoy simple things like brushing her teeth!

The workers at the evacuation center advised that these were the kinds of donations that were REALLY needed since baked goods could not be distributed due to regulations.

As our bags joined the many cots and stacks of clothes in the living area, we knew that we had done the right thing. Once again Pioneers were able to make a difference in our community.
